they could complete an interactive quiz along the way?

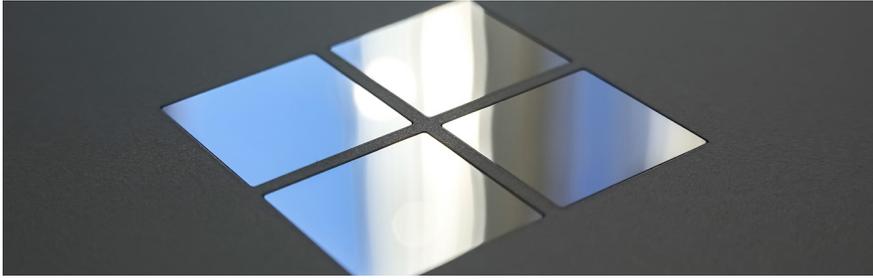
The ultimate gamification is awarding points and using leaderboards. This helps your team feel their work is being recognised, and can also strengthen their feelings of belonging.

Microsoft 365 license changes explained

Microsoft have introduced a New Commerce Experience (NCE) model for Office 365, which is essentially driving customers to take up longer term license commitments. This aims to reduce complexity around subscriptions and offers cost savings for longer term contracts.

Businesses however will have to swallow a price increase of around 15%, which is significant.

Microsoft are also removing the flexibility around licenses too; as of 1st March 2022, you won't be able to cancel licenses that you no longer need mid contract like you can now. Which is bad news for businesses who need to flex license numbers often. So that's most businesses then!

The option to add licenses at any time will remain however.

As of 1st March 2022 there will be three new subscription types:

Monthly subscription

This one is billed monthly. This subscription will be charged at a 20% premium to the annual subscription.

Annual Subscription

You can choose to be billed monthly

or annually with this one. You'll also enjoy a saving of around 20% off the monthly subscription.

36 Month Subscription

You can choose to be billed monthly, annually or upfront. This subscription will offer an additional saving to the 12 month subscription (saving percentage unknown at present).

These are big changes.

3 tips to enhance your server management

MANAGE AND MAINTAIN SOFTWARE

EMPLOY FREQUENT COOLING

Besides backing up server software and hardware, you should also have a backup for your power supply to prevent data losses during power outages. Moreover, you can integrate with various tools to expedite backups, recoveries, and status monitoring.

ARRANGE THE WIRING NEATLY

Can I print straight from my Android device?

Answer

Yes if your printer has Bluetooth or Wi-Fi. On your phone switch on Default Print Service in the settings. Open the file you want to print. Tap the menu (the three dots), print and select your printer.

How do I see how much space apps are taking up?

Answer

In Windows 10 and 11 go to Settings -> System -> Storage. Tap on Cleanup recommendations to see what software you're not using and could remove.

Does turning it off and on again really work?
